Bronco Mission Tube Door Installation Guide – Draft Copy

For Part # 45-1046 (Front) and Part # 45-1049 (Rear)

Tools You'll Need

(Most are included in the Bronco Tool Kit)

- 10mm wrench/ratchet/socket
- 13mm wrench/socket + ratchet
- 6mm Allen key/hex key or socket + ratchet
- Rivnut tool
- Drill
- 11/32" or 9mm drill bit

Step-by-Step Install Guide

Step 1: Get Your Bronco Ready

Find your Bronco (should be easy enough, right?) and park it on level ground. If you have a Bronco Tool Kit, grab it—if not, use the tools listed above.

Step 2: Unbox Everything

Open the boxes, lay out all the parts, and check that everything is there. Keep the hardware in one place so nothing gets lost.

Step 3: Remove the Factory Doors

- 1. Push the mirrors forward.
- 2. Roll down the windows (this helps avoid damage when removing the doors).
- 3. Open the door and locate the power connector in the forward door jam.
- 4. Flip back the cover, pull the connector to release it.
- 5. Find the lower hinge bolt (13mm socket) and remove it.
- 6. Locate the upper hinge bolt (also 13mm socket) and remove it.

- 7. Lift the door straight up and off the hinges.
- 8. Store the doors in a safe spot.

Repeat for all four doors.

Step 4: Install the Front Beauty Panels

- 1. Locate the top front panel.
- 2. Remove the bolts fastening the top door hinge to the body (13mm socket).
- 3. Find the small black bolts in the door jam and remove them (10mm socket or wrench—ratchet wrench makes this easier).
- 4. Grab the large beauty panel and place it over the area.
- 5. Start all bolts and snug them up, but don't fully tighten yet.
- 6. Attach the lower beauty panel the same way.
- 7. Align everything and tighten all bolts to factory specs.

Step 5: Install the Rear Beauty Panel

- 1. Find the rear beauty panel.
- 2. Locate the top rear door hinge—some Broncos have a bolt in the top hinge. If yours does, remove it and set it aside.
- 3. Locate the two 6mm nutserts in your hardware bag.
- 4. Drill a hole (11/32" or 9mm bit) into the open location on the door hinge attached to the body.
- 5. Use a rivnut tool to install the nutserts.
 - If your top hinge had a bolt, install a nutsert only on the bottom hinge.
 - If the top hinge has only a hole, install nutserts in both the top and bottom hinges.
- 6. Align the rear beauty panel with the hinges and secure it using the supplied M6 Allen bolts and flat washers.
- 7. Tighten everything down.

Step 6: Install the Tube Door Hinges

What You'll Need:

- M6 x __ Allen bolts (4)
- M6 flat washers (4)
- Front Driver Side: Upper hinge = L1 bracket, Lower hinge = L2 bracket
- Rear Driver Side: Upper hinge = M1 bracket, Lower hinge = M2 bracket

How to Install the Hinges:

- 1. Start with the **front door hinges**.
- 2. For the **top hinge**, insert the bolt and flat washer **from the bottom** of the door mount on the body.
- 3. Place the hinge over the mount, inserting a **nylon washer** between the hinge and the OEM door mount.
- 4. Secure with a flat washer and the supplied nylock nut.
- 5. Repeat the same process for the **upper rear door hinge**.

Step 7: Mount the Tube Doors

What You'll Need:

- 6mm Allen key/socket
- 13mm wrench
- Ratchet (if using a socket Allen)
- 4x M6 bolts with flat washers

Mounting the Doors:

- 1. Slightly angle the hinges outward from the Bronco body.
- 2. Grab the door and guide it over the **upper and lower latches**.
- 3. Adjust the hinges so the door sits flush with the body.
- 4. Align the striker with the slam latch, ensuring it locks properly.
- 5. Install all four bolts, making them snug but not fully tight.
- 6. Check the door height and latch engagement.
- 7. Tighten all bolts, then open and close the door a few times to test fitment.

- 8. Ensure the slam latch is tight—check the two small Allen bolts securing it.
- 9. If needed, add **red Loctite** to these bolts for extra security (not required, but recommended since tube doors take some abuse).

Final Step: Door Removal & Storage Tips

- Once the doors are set up, **only the bolts need to be removed** for quick removal.
- The hinges stay attached to the doors, making reinstallation easy.
- Keep all mounting hardware in a safe place so you don't have to hunt for it later.

You're Done!

Your Bronco now has a fresh set of tube doors! Take it for a spin, enjoy the open-air feel, and make sure everything stays snug. If anything feels off, give it a quick tweak—better safe than sorry!
